A Company Is Inserting Microchips In Some Of Their Employees

A tech company in [Wisconsin](#) held a “chip party” on Tuesday to implant microchips in its employees that will allow them to open doors, log onto computers or buy breakroom snacks by simply waving their hand. Three Square Market, also known as 32M, said that nearly half of its 85 employees agreed to be voluntarily microchipped at the company’s headquarters in River Falls.

Though 41 of 32M’s employees agreed to have the microchips implanted in their hands, there were still some workers who were apprehensive about the whole thing. Officials from the company claim that the data in the microchip is encrypted and does not use GPS, so it cannot be used to track employees’ location or obtain private information about them.
